Anne Scott, founder of Dreamweather Foundation in California, had been to The Red Shoes before. But this year, we added a new dimension to her February workshop, *Women, Wisdom and Dreams*.

On Friday morning, The Red Shoes welcomed women who are homeless from **The Bishop Ott Sweet Dreams Shelter** to a women's circle based on Anne's dream work. That morning, we saw miracles take place. Women who arrived with their emotional armor fully in place become open to their own feelings and their feminine energy in a new way. As trust built through our time of sharing, spiritual strength came up from the depths of life's challenges and carried us to a place of hope and compassion. The supportive circle and the power of meditation and story helped each woman listen to the guidance of the heart.



Women's Leadership Connection

AARP, LANO and The Red Shoes Make Baton Rouge Feel Like Home

You might know the challenge of moving to a new city with a new job, knowing nothing about the culture and feeling alone. Women's Leadership Connection (WLC) launched one year ago and our alums say it helped them develop a network and understand their new community. In just seven months, we hope Baton Rouge will feel more like home to women who have accepted jobs or are seeking employment in Baton Rouge.

Second Cohort

In October, we began orientation for our new WLC class of exciting and diverse women. Each is eager to understand the politics, culture and challenges here. Our 7 monthly meetings feature interviews with panelists chosen for their unique insights and knowledge on specific topics. What is different about this leadership group? It is the sense of community we create, a circle where women speak honestly to each other.

Lifting Loans: Supporting Women's Dreams

In December of 2007, Sharon Duncan, owner of D&D Boutique for children, was the first recipient of a micro-loan through our women's **Lifting Loans** program. Since that time, Sharon has repaid her first loan and received a second to take her from "non-store retailing" to a "brick-and-mortar" location. However, with the dream of a storefront came the harsh reality that the economy and customer traffic were not what she hoped for. Her passion for outfitting children was challenged. When Sharon came to us with the news that she was going back to a more mobile means of retail, we

brainstormed the idea of a fashion show for children... at The Red Shoes.

"The show will make parents aware of the beautiful clothes that I sell. Fourteen children will be modeling and we have 60 tickets sold for the show."

Putting her best foot forward, Sharon hopes The Red Shoes show will step up her sales.

YWCA's Dialogue on Race Hosted at The Red Shoes

In January, thanks to our donors, The Red Shoes was able to provide space at no cost to host the six-week Dialogue on Race. The Dialogue provides a unique opportunity for women and men of diverse cultures to speak frankly about racial issues while learning about the repercussions of prejudice and institutional racism.

The facilitators and participants work with ground rules of honesty, respect, attentive listening and voicing of feelings grounded in personal experience. The YWCA's program originated in 1968 and all dialogues are conducted by trained volunteer facilitators.

Our weekend with Sister Joan Chittister left many of us inspired to do something to promote peace and the wellbeing of women. The statistics that she cited in her Friday evening talk were sobering:

* In World War I, 15% of war death tolls were civilians.

* In World War II, the figure leaped to a 65% civilian death toll.

* Today, 90% of the human war toll are civilians; the majority are women and children.

In October 2000, the United Nations' Security Council adopted Resolution 1325. The main goals of resolution 1325 are to increase participation of women in conflict resolution and to protect female non-combatants from gender-based violence.

The United States is currently taking steps to create a National Action Plan to realize the resolution's goals.
